



## Rating PC-02 Performance

The Joint Commission's PC-02 performance standard is designed to measure the percentage of patients who are discharged from the hospital with a diagnosis of a urinary tract infection (UTI) that is not related to a urinary catheter (URIC) or a urinary tract procedure (UTP). PC-02

1. 30% of patients discharged with a UTI diagnosis are not related to a urinary catheter or urinary tract procedure.
2. PC-02 score >30%
3. QH score >30% (URIC, UTP) PC-02 score >30%

Healthcare organizations are required to measure and report their performance on PC-02. The score is calculated as follows: (+) or (-) PC-02 score.

- The score is calculated as follows: (+) or (-) PC-02 score.
- A score of (+) indicates that the organization's performance is at least 30% better than the national average.

A score of (-) indicates that the organization's performance is at least 20% worse than the national average. For 2016-2017, the national average was 30%. For 2018-2019, the national average was 30%.

Note: 2018 and 2019 data will be used for the initial release.

## Avoiding Unhealthy Consequences

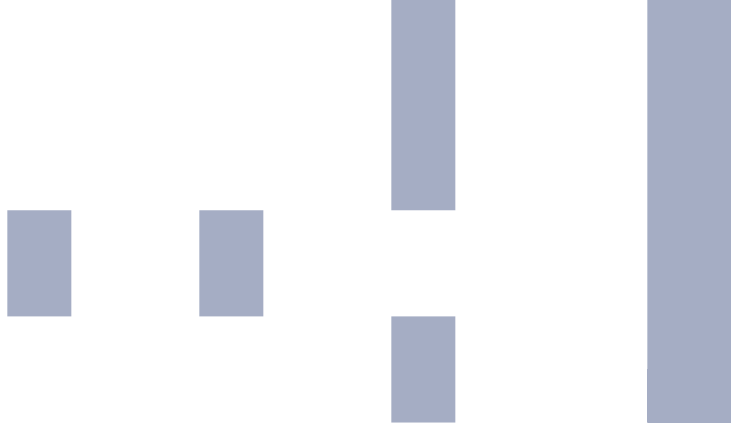
As a result of the Joint Commission's PC-02 performance standard, healthcare organizations are required to measure and report their performance on PC-02. This requirement is designed to ensure that patients are not discharged from the hospital with a UTI that is not related to a urinary catheter or urinary tract procedure.

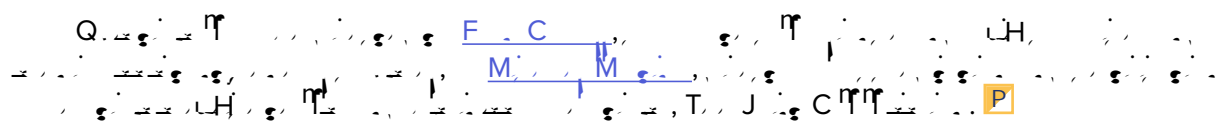
